

WOMAN, INJURED IN CRASH, DIES



Mrs. Bertha Calvert, 76 years old, who was injured December 3 when an automobile in which she was riding with her husband collided with a bus, died at 12:30 o'clock this morning in Seattle General Hospital.

The collision occurred at Fifth Avenue North and Roy Street. The Calvert machine, driven by William F. Calvert, 6282 20th Ave. N. E., caromed from the bus into a utility pole.

A 48-year-old woman pedestrian, seriously injured in a traffic accident yesterday, was given a citation for jay-walking by police after she was struck in front of her home, 936 23rd Ave. S.

The woman, Mrs. Filomena Amicarella, was taken to Harborview County Hospital, suffering a compound fracture of her right arm and cuts and bruises. She was given a citation by Traffic Investigators G. G. Massie and E. E. Manus. The automobile was driven by Mrs. E. Standert of Kent.

Charlotte Collins, 937 N. 89th St., suffered head, chest and knee injuries in an automobile collision at Third Avenue North and Thomas Street; C. F. Schlosstein, 1611 40th Ave., suffered leg injuries when his car hit a parked machine at 2711 Jackson St., and Elizabeth Rodgers, 309 Melrose Ave., suffered a fractured ankle in a collision at East Marginal Way and Spokane Street.

Funeral services for Mrs. Calvert will be held at 1 o'clock Wednesday at the Bonney-Watson funeral home. Burial will be at Washelli.

Mrs. Calvert was born in Wyoming and came to Seattle in 1903. She was treasurer of the Rainier Chapter, D. A. R., and historian of the Washington Descendants of Mayflower Society. She is survived by her husband and a sister, Mrs. Henry M. White, both of Seattle, and a nephew, Lieut. Henry M. White, Jr., U. S. N., in the Aleutians.
